At the request of the Applicant we are offering this correspondence in support of a partial release of monies for improvements constructed at the Northampton Community College site. Our records indicate there are two agreements under which funds were escrowed. They were prepared by the Applicant's Engineer, Herbert, Rowland & Grubic Inc. and both are dated April 22, 2014. The Public Improvement Cost Estimate totaled \$1,298,179.20. The Stormwater Improvement Cost Estimate totaled \$593,280.00

Based on our field observations we offer the following comments:

Public Improvement Cost Estimate

Item C. 1 1/2" Overlay to Railroad Avenue

We recommend releasing \$37,356.00 (50%) at this time. We were never notified when paving took place for this line item and was unable to observe the placement, material type and depth of the overlay. We recommend the Applicant obtain core borings at suitable intervals and obtain a lab analysis to provide us with depth and composition of material, along with a certification that it meets the design specifications. Upon recent of a satisfactory report the remaining monies may be released.

Item D. Required Landscaping

We recommend releasing \$76,128 (75%) until we have an opportunity to see how well the plantings have survived their first winter season.

Stormwater Improvements Cost Estimate

On two different occasions, site observations indicated standing water in Basins A2, H2 & H3 after the period of time in which all water should have infiltrated. Therefore, we conclude these basins do not function per design and ordinance requirements. An investigative course of action should be recommended by the Applicant's Engineer followed by recommendations for remediation. That process cannot begin until there is no danger of frost in the ground. Until this is resolved we recommend retaining Item A in the amount of \$64,875.00 (100%) in the escrow account. The amounts in Items B & C may be released.

Based on our review of this request, we recommend the Applicant receive a reduction to its posted escrow as follows:

A. 100% Reduction \$ 42,000.00

B. Separate Account

C. Reduce all items by 100% except 1 1/2" overlay on Railroad Avenue (50%)

Additional Temporary Easement Requested From Pocono Township

Dear Ken:

After our meeting with the Monroe County Conservation District (MCCD) and our subsequent conference call to clarify our proposed response to the District's review comments, we have determined that BCRA's as yet to be selected contractor will require additional temporary easement to perform his construction activities. Two maps are attached which depict the areas of additional temporary easement required. The reasons for these additional temporary easements are as follows:

A. Rt. 611 Side of Pocono Creek

- 1. The MCCD requires that the access from Rt. 611 including the staging area be included in the project area.
- The temporary soil stockpile area is to be included within the limits of disturbance and project area.
- 3. The E &S silt filter bags need to have silt sox down gradient and along the contours not across the contours. They are also required to be within the limits of disturbance and the project area. This moves some of these filter sox outside the existing temporary easement.
- 4. A frac tank will be required to be placed in the stockpile area for the collection of the mud utilized for the stream boring.

B. I-80 Side of Pocono Creek

- Since the BCRA is required by its easement agreement with Pocono Township to
 install a water service line to the Pocono Township Sewage Pumping Station, MCCD
 wants that area included in the permit application to avoid a likely major amendment
 to the NPDES Construction Activity permit at a later date thus requiring additional
 time and money. This is true even if the BCRA construction crews perform the
 work.
- 2. Since this water service and a portion of the main are located within the 100 foot buffer of Pocono Creek and with Pocono Creek being a high quality stream, erosion



control blanket will need to be installed all along the creek on this side. Placement of silt sox down gradient of the work area will be required as well.

- 3. BCRA's contractor will require a rock construction entrance and soil stockpile adjacent to the pumping station access drive.
- 4. Additional staging area is required alongside the ball field for the boring subcontractor and for storage of pipe and equipment. This location is a mostly open area and includes the area to install the service line to the concession stand.
- 5. The potential access from Rt. 715 where the 12" water main is proposed through the Township property is too steep to maneuver some of the equipment and material supply trucks for the boring and pipe installation,

Due to the unusual shapes and types of the requested temporary easements, it would be difficult to provide metes and bounds for these easements. It would be much easier to refer to the 2 attached maps in a general temporary access and construction easement amendment to the existing signed easement agreement.
