Sewer Committee Report: Commissioner Coover stated 46 properties were sent letters concerning the De Minimus Policy. To date the township has refunded approximately \$10,000.00. Letters were sent to approximately 107 properties informing them of the

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process to install a water meter and possible qualify for the De Minimus use policy. To date BCRA has had ten requests to install water meters. Approximately 60 properties owe tapping fees and/or user charges equaling approximately \$200,000.00 and letters are being prepared to be sent.

Dan Snyder, Township Resident, questioned the status of a refund after spending \$1,900.00 to connect to the lateral. Commissioner Coover indicated decisions were still in the making for those types of situations. Discussion followed.
